1. Chapman Avenue – Santiago Canyon College
2. Santiago Canyon Road – Irvine Lake
3. Black Star Canyon Road - Silverado Intersection
4. Silverado Canyon Road – Community Center
5. Silverado Canyon Road – Post Office
6. Silverado Canyon Road – Maple Springs Visitor Center
7. Santiago Canyon Road – Williams Canyon Road, Jackson Ranch area
8. Modjeska Canyon Road – Modjeska Grade Road Intersection
9. Modjeska Canyon Road – Community Center

1. Grand Avenue & Ortega Highway - Elsinore
2. Ortega Highway – Lookout Restaurant
3. Ortega Highway – Main Divide Truck Trail
4. Ortega Highway – El Cariso Village, Candy Store
5. Ortega Highway – Ortega Falls
6. Ortega Highway – San Juan Campground
7. Ortega Highway - Hot Springs Canyon Road
8. Ortega Highway - Casper’s Wilderness Park
9. Ortega Highway – Antonio Parkway
10. Ortega Highway – Metrolink San Juan Capistrano

Carbon Canyon Road (142) between Brea & Chino Hills, 7AM-9AM & 4PM-6PM, Daily:

1. Lambert Avenue & Valencia Avenue
2. Carbon Canyon Road – Carbon Canyon Regional Park
3. Carbon Canyon Road – Lilac Lane

4. Carbon Canyon Road – Hillside Road
5. Carbon Canyon Road – Canyon Hills Road
